4. Any other permits required (e.g. Canadian Wildlife Service).

*** NOTE ***

1. In accordance with the *Wilderness and Ecological Reserves Act*, and pursuant regulations and policies, access to the sensitive nesting areas of seabird ecological reserves is restricted to individuals with a permit from Parks and Natural Areas Division.
2. All visitors must be accompanied by a Seabird Ecological Reserve Guide. A list of guides is available on our website or by contacting the Biologist at 709 635-4529.
3. The number of permits available is limited. Multi-day permits are limited to consecutive nights.
4. Applications are processed on a first come first serve basis.
5. Please allow a minimum of two weeks for your application to be processed.
6. If a permit is granted, the applicant will be required to submit a Field Report summarizing activities within the reserve and any published material resulting from the work. The applicant agrees to acknowledge Parks and Natural Areas Division in all work produced as a result of access to the reserve. Other conditions may apply.
7. If a permit is granted, all parties land on the island at their own risk.
