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HIGHLIGHTS 2010-2011

The AMC created research opportunities for thirty-seven students; supported seven student presentations at national and international Metropolis conferences; and expanded the NGO-based student internship program. In addition, AMC research affiliates supervised twenty-five Master's and doctoral theses.

Scholars affiliated with the AMC produced 113 publications, eighty-eight conference papers and generated \$898,572 in new, external research money.

The AMC awarded \$125,449 in research grants to 14 projects led by scholars based in six different universities across Atlantic Canada.

The AMC and its domains delivered 111 knowledge translation/mobilization activities including *On the Move: Out-Migration, In-Migration in Rural and Small Town Nova Scotia* in partnership with Citizenship and Immigration Canada and St. Francis Xavier University.

Five knowledge mobilization projects worth a total of \$24,450 received funding.

1.0 INTRODUCTION

Ce rapport annuel du Centre Métropolis Atlantique fait état des activités entre le 1er avril 2010 et le 31 mars 2011. Il marque également la seconde année dans la phase III du projet Métropolis (2007 — 2012). Cette troisieme année de la phase III a été très fructueuse pour le CMA et a vu de nombreux projets nouveaux et publications, ainsi que plusieurs activités visant le transfert de la connaissance.

Créé en janvier 2004, le Centre Métropolis Atlantique met en évidence les perspectives et les préoccupations de la région atlantique relatives aux politiques stratégiques nationales du projet Métropolis et de ses partenaires fédéraux. Le CMA est affilié à quatre autres centres Métropolis (établis en 1996) et fait partie d'un réseau transnational lié au projet Métropolis international.

Le CMA a pour but principal de contribuer à l'élargissement des connaissances relatives aux politiques et aux tendances dans le secteur de l'immigration, aux changements et aux migrations de la population ainsi qu'aux priorités et aux programmes relatifs à l'immigration sur le plan régional et national. Étant donné que l'immigration devient depuis quelques années une plus grande préoccupation au Canada atlantique et une réalité plus connue, le CMA concentre ses efforts sur l'attraction, l'intégration et la rétention des nouveaux immigrants dans les communautés anglophones et francophones.

Le CMA œuvre dans les deux langues officielles à partir des bureaux de Halifax et de Moncton, favorisant la promotion d'un dialogue entre les communautés linguistiques et de divers milieux. Grâce à l'appui des universités de la région, les cinq groupes ou domaines de recherche régionaux du Centre peuvent rassembler des chercheurs, des organismes communautaires, des fournisseurs de service aux immigrants ainsi que des responsables de l'élaboration de politiques sur le plan municipal, provincial et fédéral (voir les résumés des domaines dans l'annexe A).

The AMC is managed by three Directors – Dr. Madine VanderPlaat, Saint Mary's University (lead university), Dr. Chedly Belkhodja, Université de Moncton and Dr. Marguerite Cassin, Dalhousie

University. The five domains/priority areas housed at the AMC are briefly described below. Detailed information on each of the domains is presented in Appendix A.

The Gender, Migration and Diversity/ Immigrant Women research domain provides a unique entry point to identify issues of particular relevance to immigrant women that might otherwise be overlooked. The objective is to provide a regional and national focus for gender-based analysis of immigration and diversity. This domain has a specific focus on the Family, Children and Youth policy priority area. (Domain Leaders: Dr. Evie Tastsoglou and Dr. Alexandra Dobrowolsky, Saint Mary's University).

The *Economic and Labour Market Integration* research domain investigates the economic effects of immigration, economic performance of immigrants and the role of socioeconomic factors in attracting and retaining immigrants in smaller and rural communities. (Domain Leaders: Dr. Ather Akbari, Saint Mary's University and Dr. Ted MacDonald, University of New Brunswick)

Les communautés accueillantes examinent la capacité d'un pays à recevoir et à intégrer les immigrants, les réfugiés et les membres de minorités repose sur de nombreux facteurs d'ordre social, dont plusieurs peuvent être grandement influencés par les politiques gouvernementales. Cette priorité de recherche permettra de déterminer quels instruments de politique publique sont les plus propices à contribuer à la capacité du Canada, de ses villes et de ses collectivités à recevoir et à intégrer avec succès les immigrants, les réfugiés et les membres de minorités. Elle présentera également l'occasion d'identifier, selon des méthodes empiriques, des pratiques exemplaires qui pourront être adaptées de sorte à être mises en œuvre dans d'autres contextes. (Domain Leaders : Dr. Sylvia Kasparian et Dr. Cristophe Traisnel, Université de Moncton)

Canada's immigration program, like its multicultural approach to inclusion, is designed to bring benefits to Canadian society as well as an offer of a better life to immigrants, refugees, and their immediate families. It is not only the Canadian economy that feels the effects of immigration. Accordingly, the *Citizenship, Social and Civic Integration/ Citoyenneté et intégration sociale, culturelle et civique* domain looks at the social and cultural effects of immigration and diversity on Canada and will determine the extent to which there are risks to societal well-being, to full participation of the members of these groups as citizens, and to the cohesion of Canadian society overall. (Domain Leader: Dr. Pauline Gardiner-Barber, Dalhousie University).

Concerns over social cohesion and national security, especially the contemporary preoccupation with terrorism, have raised the public profile of debate surrounding how Canada and its justice and security systems can ensure a balanced and fair approach to an increasingly diverse population - to maintain order, public safety and national security while preserving civil liberties and the Canadian multicultural model of an open, diverse society. These are the challenges facing the *Justice, Policing and Security* domain. (Domain Leader: Constance MacIntosh, Dalhousie University).

2.0 Training Activities

A total of thirty-seven students and seven non-students were provided with training opportunities in 2010-2011. The majority of these individuals were employed as research assistants on AMC or externally-funded research projects. This figure also includes three Master's students employed as interns within relevant NGOs, and two Master's students hired as office assistants to help with various projects at the AMC office. Table 2.1 indicates the number of students who have participated in the AMC in various capacities during the reporting period.

The AMC continued and expanded upon the Student-NGO internship programme launched in winter 2009. The Immigrant Settlement and Integration Services (Halifax, NS), the Refugee and Immigrant Advisory Council (St. John's, NL), the Association for New Canadians (St. John's, NL) and La Fédération acadienne de la Nouvelle-Écosse (Halifax, NS) employed three students based at regional universities from September 2010 – May 2011. (see Appendix D.1 for project description and other details).

Meanwhile, the AMC organized two brown bag public sessions in which students from last year's internships presented their experiences with the NGOs and discussed the contribution of these experiences to their learning process and career development. Based on these sessions one of the interns who had been based in the Halifax Refugee Clinic, Kirsten Van Houten, was invited

by the New Brunswick Council on the Status of Women to make further presentations in Saint John and Fredericton on the topic of female asylum seekers and the challenges they face.

Two Master's students were also hired as office assistants during the reporting period to help with various projects including the Saint Mary's University Research Expo, the widespread distribution of the AMC Policy Briefs across the region, as well as promoting other events across campuses.

The AMC sponsored five students to attend the 13th National Metropolis Conference in Vancouver (see Appendix B.3) and two students received funding to present at the 14th International Metropolis Conference in The Hague.

3.0 Research

3.1 Publications

In 2010-2011 researchers affiliated with the AMC produced four books, nineteen book chapters, 42 journal articles, and 48 other publications. Table 3.1 depicts the distribution of publications across domains. There is slight duplication of numbers across domains due to the interdisciplinary nature of some of the works. A full list of publications is included in Appendix C.1.

3.2 Grant Competition

In October 2010 a Call for Proposals was launched for strategic grants of up to \$20,000, and pilot projects up to a maximum of \$5,000. Based on the recommendations of an external review committee, a total of 14 projects from Dalhousie University, Saint Mary's University, Acadia University, University of New Brunswick, University of Prince Edward Island, Memorial University and Université de Moncton were supported. 4.0 Knowledge Transfer/Mobilization Activities

Knowledge transfer and mobilization activities remained a primary focus for the AMC during 2010-2011, with additional emphasis on promoting regional events and activities outside of the Halifax - Moncton nodes. These initiatives included sponsoring a Speaker Series at the University of Prince Edward Island, PEI, and the International Student Career Video project at Memorial University, St. John's, NL, through the KT grant framework. (see below "Knowledge Mobilization Grants", for full list of KT grants)

Our domains were also active in improving the outreach of KT activities. The Welcoming Communities domain held two community meetings in Edmunston and Caraquet, NB, 5-6 May 2010. The meetings explored the theme: *Immigrating Outside Large Cities: Possibility of Better Integration or Additional Constraints?* The report on these activities, including recommendations, can be found on our website (http://atlantic.metropolis.net/events e.html).

Two public events were held in St. John's in January 2011: the Economic and Labour Market Integration domain co-sponsored a webinar/synergy session called *Land of Opportunity?* Why Immigrants Fare Better in Atlantic Canada (full details in Appendix D.4), while the Cross-Domain Initiative held Why Social Networks Matter for Immigrants: A Community Discussion with Researchers, with the support of local NGOs.

A half-day event on rural migration was held in St. Francis Xavier University, Antigonish, NS, in March 2011, in which academics presented the results of their Metropolis-funded research in rural Nova Scotia, and which brought together a panel of immigrants, international students and Black Nova Scotians to share and discuss their experiences of life in small town Nova Scotia. This event was sponsored by the Atlantic Metropolis Centre, St. Francis Xavier University and Citizenship and Immigration Canada. (full schedule and attendee list appear in Appendix D.2)

4.1 Centre Activities

AMC 2010-2011 Policy Research Symposium

The AMC held its 6th Annual Policy Research Symposium on May 25-26, 2010, at the newly-built Atrium, Saint Mary's University, Halifax, Nova Scotia. The event was attended by approximately 70 researchers, NGO representatives and government partners.

The Symposium was organized round the theme "Thinking Outside the Permanent Resident Box". Twelve presenters drawn from the NGO, academic, policy and government sectors discussed International Students, Refugees and Temporary Foreign workers.

Participating federal partners included ACOA, Citizenship and Immigration Canada, Canadian Heritage, and Service Canada. Non-Governmental Organizations included: Multicultural Association of Carleton County Inc., Canadian Ecumenical Justice Initiatives, Immigrant Settlement and Integration Services, PEI Association for Newcomers to Canada and Association for New Canadians (St. John's, NF).

There were representatives from the Province of New Brunswick, Straits Highland Regional Development Agency, and the Nova Scotia Human Rights commission. A full agenda and participants list can be found in Appendix D.2

The event garnered very positive feedback as well as some constructive comments:

AMC Open House

In December 2010, we invited our partners and affiliates to the first AMC Open House held at the new offices in Saint Mary's Atrium. About 40 guests enjoyed this opportunity for networking and meeting in a more informal, friendly environment, and many included their family members and children.

AMC Newsletter

During the reporting period, the AMC released three newsletters in order to better share centre news, and in particular promote upcoming events and provide synopses of past ones. The newsletter was revamped to confirm to a professionally-designed format and included pictures, student reports and links to AMC in local media.

5.0 Network Activities

5.1 Regional and National Partnerships, Collaborations and Networking

The AMC engages in partnership, collaboration and networking activities aimed at developing research capacity, increasing the profile of the centre, leveraging research funds, and extending the research network. Domains have established successful local partnerships which include:

SSHRC, CIC, Canadian Heritage, Status of Women Canada, Nova Scotia Advisory Council on the Status of Women, Nova Scotia Department of Education; Immigrant Settlement and Integration Services (ISIS), Multicultural Association of Nova Scotia (MANS), Maritime Centre of Excellence for Women's Health, Nova Scotia Office of Immigration, Immigrant Women's Group, YMCA, Pier 21 Newcomers Program, and the Atlantic Population Table. Details of individual partners for each domain are listed separately in Appendix A.

All of the directors and domain leaders engage with academic, government and NGO partners locally and nationally on a regular basis, both through the domain committees and in project-based research work. As examples of such cross-sector and interacademic activities, Dr. Madine VanderPlaat, AMC director, spoke at ISIS in December 2010, presenting her and Barbara Cottrell's research "My Kids Want To Eat Pork" to a group of NGO staff-members, while Dr. Chedly Belkhodja, AMC director based at Université de Moncton was invited to present his research on "International Student: Challenges and Opportunities" as part of the Dalhousie Speaker Series organized by the Dalhousie Department of Political Science.

Staff from the Halifax AMC office participated in various meetings, public lectures and conferences. Shiva Nourpanah attended the Immigrant Settlement and Integration Services Café Diversity on the theme of the human rights of immigrants, as well as participating in meetings with members of the ISIS research committee to discuss how to improve knowledge transfer with immigrants. She also attended the Halifax Refugee Clinic Anniversary celebration and open house in July 2010, and participated as a guest speaker in the HRC Sunday Speaker Series where she was part of a panel discussion on "Searching for Peace in Canada: Perspectives on Conflict and Asylum Seeking" (February 2011).

Both Serperi Sevgur and Shiva from the AMC office were sponsored by the AMC to form a panel for the Multicultural Association of Nova Scotia event "Building Bridges" (October 2010), together with three other AMC student affiliates. The five graduate students were presented various aspects of their research on specific immigrant groups in Nova Scotia, and the event attracted very positive media coverage.

AMC staff also attended the Human Trafficking Awareness Symposium hosted by Halifax Refugee Clinic. Collaborative relationships have been fostered with NGOs and between academics in the region.

5.2 International Linkages and Collaborations

AMC researchers continued to expand networks internationally and strategically build linkages with colleagues working on migration issues in a number of countries in Europe, Africa, Asia and Australasia.

The three AMC directors as well as domain leaders Pauline Gardiner-Barber, Ather Akbari and Ted McDonald and student affiliates Teeba Alsafar and Sinziana Chira attended the 16th International Metropolis Conference in The Hague, The Netherlands, where they networked with colleagues from around the world and presented on multi-national panels. Further examples of the international activities include the following:

Ted MacDonald, co-leader of the Economic and Labour Market Integration domain presented at the University of Tasmania in August 2010. His presentation was titled: Incidence and Returns to Apprenticeship Training in Canada: The Role of Family Background and Immigrant Status.

Pauline Gardiner-Barber co-organized a panel on "Political Economies and the Migration Question" in New Orleans, USA, for the American Athropological Association.

Christophe Traisnel, domain leader of the Welcoming Communities, presented in Avignon, France, at the conference Minorités culturelles: expressions, territoires organzied by l'Université d'Avignon and the Association française d'études canadiennes in June 2010. He also made the presentation: «Les francophonies canadiennes à l'épreuve du bilinguisme officiel: possibilité politique ou contrainte juridique? », at the conference La démocratie au Canada: dynamique intellectuelle et culturelle d'un projet en constante évolution, at Cambridge University, UK.

6.0 Governance and Budget

6.1 Governance

The AMC provides for direct input into Centre planning and activities to government policy makers, representatives of the lead universities, and NGOs through their memberships on the Centre's Board of Directors, its Program and Dissemination Committee (the central planning committee of the Centre), and its Domain Committees. The governance structure for the Centre is included in Appendix E.1.

Membership on the 2009-2010 Board of Directors and P&D Committee can be found in Appendices E.2 and E.3 respectively. The AMC structure of governance also provides for government and NGO membership on its peer-review Research Evaluation Committee (Appendix E.4). There are two staff-members in the Halifax node office. Shiva Nourpanah was hired as the Centre Coordinator and Communications Officer in June 2010, while Serperi Sevgur was hired to as a part-time Administrative Assistant in July. Marley Levins continues to cooperate with the centre on special events and projects. Golsa Kafili, another graduate student, has also provided logistical support for the AMC Open House, as well as remaining active in distributing promotional materials and notices for events across Halifax campuses. In the Moncton node administrative duties are shared by two part-time employees, Mathieu Lanteigne and Valérie Roy.

6.3 Budget

The AMC receives \$307,000 annually from SSHRC. It does not have any other sources of direct funding. 2010-2011 expenditures were in the following general categories.

Expenditures exceeding annual revenue are covered by third party recoverables and a special KT fund established with monies generated by the 2008 National Metropolis Conference held in Halifax.

A detailed budget as well as projections for 2011-2012 is attached as Appendix E.6.

6.4 Support from Consortium Universities

The Halifax node of the AMC operates from a suite of offices in the Atrium Building, at Saint Mary's University. The space at Suite 213 has been generously donated by the University. In addition, Saint Mary's all expenses related to telecommunications. The Moncton node is housed at the Université de Moncton where facilities are provided free of charge.

Each of the partner universities contributes a course release for its domain leaders (\$32,000). In addition, Moncton contributes \$5,000, while Dalhousie and Saint Mary's each contribute \$8,000 in course releases for the Directors. Saint Mary's also provides accounting and administrative services to the AMC as well as technological support. Dalhousie and Moncton provide financial services, research services, computers and computer support and office supplies.

In addition, lead and partner institutions provided travel funding for Centre researchers and fellowship funding for graduate student training.

6.5 Non-Research Project Specific Funding from Federal Departments

Human Resources and Social Development provided \$3000 to the AMC to support student participation at the 13th National Metropolis Conference in Vancouver. With this funding, the AMC was able to pay registration, travel and accommodation costs for seven students from four universities in three Atlantic provinces.

7.0 Future Planning

With the end of the Metropolis Project for 2012 well in sight, the AMC directors, domain leaders and affiliates have already devoted time and energy in several meetings specifically discussing future strategies on the potential shape of immigration research in the region. There is strong consensus across board that the momentum, experience and expertise gained in this increasingly vital field should not be lost, but should form the foundation for an even more comprehensive structure which encompasses issues such as demographic challenges. The 2011 Annual Symposium in Fredericton is dedicated to exploring this theme in a coherent format, and we look forward to working with our partners across the spectrum to develop a fresh, broad-based and high-quality forum which both replaces and enhances the work of the Metropolis Project in Atlantic Canada.

Planning is underway for a major event showcasing and celebrating the work which has been done in the AMC over the past years. Our domain leaders are already discussing a cross-comain event, tentatively scheduled for November 2011, which will bring together domain members and affiliates from across the Atlantic region, in order to share the their research and plan for future endeavours.

Another exciting event planned for 2012 is a Symposium in collaboration with the University of Brennen and the Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade, Canada. As part of a series of events to celebrate the fortieth anniversary of signing a treaty on scientific and technical collaboration between Germany and Canada, this Symposium, tentatively titled "Migration in Port Cities", is scheduled for June 2012, to take place at the Pier 21 Museum in Halifax.

Meanwhile, as decribed in the sections above, we remain committed to the priorities outlined in the 2009-2010 report: continuing in our efforts to expand the outreach of AMC activities across the Atlantic region and with focus on small communities, fostering international activities and linkages, and implementing a strong, active Knowledge Mobilization plan.

C.3 GRANT COMPETITION

Atlantic Metropolis Centre 2010-2011 Research and Knowledge Transfer Call for Proposals and Guidelines

GUIDELINES FOR APPLICANTS FOR RESEARCH GRANTS 2010-2011

1. Eligibility

- 1.1 Applicants (i.e., Principal Investigators) must hold a regular academic appointment or a long-term appointment as a sessional lecturer at an Atlantic Canadian university. Professors Emeriti from these universities are eligible to apply. All applicants must be formally affiliated with the Centre.
- 1.2 Individuals who wish to become affiliated with the AMC may apply by completing an AMC Research Affiliation Application form available on the AMC web site at www.atlantic.metropolis.net.

2. Clarification of Terms: Co-Investigator, Collaborator, Graduate Student, NGO Partners

- 2.1 SSHRC's and the AMC's regulations are as follows:
 - a) A Co-Investigator is a Centre participant who is responsible for specific aspects of a research project. Graduate students may not be listed as Co-Investigators. Students are not permitted to assume responsibility for a research project in the event that the original Principal Investigator is unable to maintain principal responsibility and/or finish the project. SSHRC is also sensitive to the fact that students should be allowed to finish their studies with a minimum of interruptions;
 - b) Foreign researchers are to be categorized as Collaborators rather than as Co-Investigators. Research expenses of international collaborators are not eligible for SSHRC funding. However, travel and subsistence costs of foreign collaborators may be covered if these expenses are directly related to their participation in the research project.
 - c) Representatives of NGO partners are Collaborators rather than Co-Investigators.

3. General Principles and Conditions

- 3.1 It is the AMC's practice to consider only one application from any of our research affiliates in the strategic grant competition. For pilot projects research affiliates may submit one application on their own behalf OR one application on their own behalf and one on a student's behalf OR two on behalf of students.
- 3.2 Consideration will be given to all applicants, but funding will be provided based on the merit of individual applications, policy relevance, and potential contribution to the AMC's research mandate. At its own discretion, the Research Evaluation Committee may require further peer review of grant applications.

- 3.3 Proposals should be clear, justify the use of all monies requested, and provide all information requested on the application form.
- 3.4 Because the significance of the work is evaluated, applicants must provide a theoretical rationale and a full explication of methodology and data analysis.
- 3.5 Applicants must indicate as precisely as possible the policy linkages of the proposed research project, based on consultations with relevant policy-makers in CIC and/or in partnering federal departments (see Appendix A for a list of Metropolis Federal Partners); or with policy-makers at the provincial or municipal level.
- 3.6 Where appropriate, applicants must also indicate the specific implications of the research project for the concerns of, or for programs and services provided by other relevant stakeholders (e.g., multicultural groups, NGO's and other immigrant serving groups), based on direct consultations and/or involvement with these stakeholders.
- 3.7 Applicants must provide an abstract of the project (250 word maximum), including the name of the Principal Investigator (and Co-Investigator(s), if any) and project title.
- 3.8 The following elements must be addressed in the abstract:
 - a) subject;
 - b) objective(s);
 - c) methodology;
 - d) findings;
 - e) likely conclusions in terms of:
 - scientific implications (or repercussions) and applications (or concrete uses);

AND

- potential implications and applications for public policy and programs related to immigration and integration.
- 3.9 Applicants must provide a clear and innovative dissemination plan, consistent with the unique nature and expectations of the Metropolis Project. The project budget may take the requirements of the dissemination plan into account.
- 3.10 Grant funds may be used only for the project and purposes described in the application, subject to any special conditions given in the Notice of Award.
- 3.11 Investigators must also abide by the policies and regulations operative in their home university.
- 3.12 The transfer of funds from one budget category to another is permitted, within limits according to the needs of the research as it progresses.
- 3.13 Grant funds may not be used to provide honoraria or release time stipends for the Principal Investigator and/or Co-Investigators and/or Collaborators. However, NGOs may be reimbursed for their staff time spent on the study.
- 3.14 The use of funds for a previously unspecified cost or new budget item requires prior approval by the Chair of the Research Evaluation Committee. Please address your request to one of the AMC's Directors.

- 3.15 Funds will be transferred to the Principal Investigator in the form of a Trust Account to be established by the Office of Financial Services at the Principal Investigator's home university. The transfer of funds must be requested by the Principal Investigator within 6 months of receipt of the letter of notification. Failure to request the release of funds within this time frame may result in reallocation of funds. For grants over \$10,000, 10 per cent of total funds will be withheld until the submission of a final report as per section 10.1.
- 3.16 Normally the term of the grant will be in accordance with the applicant's request or as negotiated with the AMC. The term may be extended for an additional period upon written request to the Directors of the Centre. Unspent funds are to be returned to the Centre at the conclusion of the project.

4. Termination

4.1 An award may be terminated if conditions are not observed. Unspent funds must be returned to the Centre if the award is terminated.

5. Grants

- 5.1 The applicant, his/her Department Chair (or Dean in non-departmentalized Faculties), and the University Research Grants Officer must sign the application. If the applicant is the Department Chair (or Dean), he/she will require the signature of the appropriate Dean (or Vice-President).
- 5.2 The Chair's signature signifies that he/she is aware of the application, approves of the use of department facilities, services or other resources as may be necessary for the work, and that the applicant has (or will be allowed) the necessary research time within his/her normal work schedule.
- 5.3 Principal Investigators must assume responsibility for any overdraft on the grants provided and they should not expect supplementary funding beyond the original grant from the AMC.

6. Student Support

- 6.1 The pay rate for Graduate Research Assistants (GRAs) may vary from university to university and from discipline to discipline, and also by the student's level in the graduate program. Applicants should consult with the appropriate office on their campus for their University's guidelines.
- 6.2 The AMC will contact the Principal Investigator once his or her grant has been disbursed to collect a list of all students working on AMC-funded research including names, level of academic study (e.g. M.A. or Ph.D.), academic discipline, and contact information.
- 6.3 Copies of all theses produced by students emanating from AMC-funded research should be forwarded to the AMC (electronic or unbound copies are preferred, in order to duplicate and forward them to the Metropolis Project Team in Ottawa). Distribution will be subject to embargos arising from university thesis regulations and copyrights.

- 6.4 An effort shall be made by the Principal Investigator to ensure significant student participation by involving student assistants in AMC-funded research projects in Metropolis conferences, seminars and workshops.
- 6.5 For grants over \$10,000, 60% of the total award amount must be allocated towards student training (e.g. student research assistants, student participation in Metropolis conferences, seminars and workshops). There is no minimum student allocation for pilot project grants.

7. Travel

7.1 In addition to transportation and accommodation costs, researchers may claim up to a maximum of \$47 per diem.

8. Other Budget Items on Detailed Budget Sheet

- 8.1 Professional/Technical Services This category is intended to cover expenses such as computer programming, data cleaning, and completion of statistical runs. Items such as transcription or data entry are more appropriate for the category of Clerical/Support Staff.
- 8.2 Non-Disposable Equipment This category is intended to cover the purchase or rental of such items as tape recorders, microphones, transcription equipment, etc., not computers.
- 8.3 Computer Hardware and Software Applicants are reminded that the purchase and/or upgrading of computers must be fully justified given that participating universities are expected to provide infrastructural support for the AMC research program. For example, the replacement of an applicant's departmental issue computer is not eligible.
- 8.4 Other (Research) Expenses This category is intended to cover such expenses as reimbursement of NGO staff time spent on the study; the provision of daycare services for study respondents during interviews; participants' honoraria, etc.

9. Cross-Centre proposals

- 9.1 Applicants are encouraged to liaise with affiliates of other Canadian Metropolis Centres (see http://metropolis.net) to develop proposals that have a larger scope and / or are comparative in nature.
- 9.2 Cross-centre applications should incorporate research that includes Atlantic-based research, as well as research based out of the participating Metropolis Centres (CERIS, the Prairies (Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta) or Metropolis British Columbia).
- 9.3 Affiliates of each centre will be responsible for meeting the requirements of their centres, and projects funded by one centre may not necessarily by funded by the other/s.

Adjudication Process for Cross-Centre Call for Proposals

Please note that the Adjudication Committees of the Metropolis Centres will meet after all proposals have been submitted and adjudicated to discuss the funding of all Cross-Centre applications.

10. Evaluation and Evaluation Criteria

- 10.1 Grant applications will be reviewed by the Research Evaluation Committee which consists of nine members including,
 - a) four academics drawn from outside Atlantic Canada and preferably affiliated with one of the other Metropolis Centres,
 - b) one academic drawn from a collaborating Atlantic Canadian University,
 - c) one federal representative,
 - d) one provincial representative,
 - e) one municipal representative
 - f) one NGO representative.

There will also be a non-voting Chair of the Committee. The Research Evaluation Committee will make its recommendations to the Board of Directors, and the Board, in turn, will decide on grants on an annual basis. The decision of the Board of Directors on grant applications is final.

- 10.2 Funding will be based on the following criteria:
 - a) Academic excellence of the researchers
 - b) Merit of the proposed project
 - c) Relevance of research for attraction, retention and integration of immigrants to Atlantic Canada
 - d) Policy relevance of the proposal
 - e) Clearly defined knowledge dissemination strategy
 - f) Justification of the budget and the work plan

Priority will be given to projects that demonstrate collaboration among government, NGO and academic sectors and provide training opportunities for students.

11. Reports

- 11.1 Successful grantees are expected to produce a 20-25 page paper for the Atlantic Metropolis Centre Working Papers Series and to complete a project report at the conclusion of the project. Successful grantees are not eligible to reapply in subsequent Atlantic Metropolis Centre grant competitions if working papers are outstanding. In addition, for grants over \$10,000, 10 per cent of total funds will be withheld until these documents have been submitted.
- 11.2 In addition to the working paper, researchers are required to produce a maximum three-page summary which is to include key findings and policy implications.
- 11.3 The paper and summary (10.1 and 10.2) are to describe not only the research findings, conclusions and methodology but also and in a substantive manner the policy issue the research addresses and the implications of the research for policy and/or practice.
- 11.4 Grantees must provide annual updates on activities related to AMC-funded research projects, including publications, participation in conferences, workshops or seminars, project funding secured from other sources, etc. This information will be requested by Centre staff each spring and included in the AMC Annual Report.
