





# Police-Reported Hate Crime in Canada

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#### **Data sources**

#### **Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Survey**

- Police-reported information gathered from administrative records
- Annual survey
- Data on all crimes (approximately 100 categories)
- Census survey
- Police interpretations are restricted to law and policies
- Includes only those incidents deemed by police to be criminal and to have been motivated by hate

#### **General Social Survey (GSS)**

- Self-reported victimization survey
- Conducted every 5 years (last completed in 2004)
- 8 crime types (sexual assault, physical assault, robbery, break and enter, motor vehicle theft/parts, vandalism, theft of household property, theft of personal property)
- Sample survey (excludes those aged 15 years and under, institutional residents)
- Reflect the perceptions of individuals and rely upon respondents to accurately interpret and report events
- Captures crimes not reported to police

#### Collection

- Hate crime on the UCR 2.2 survey (22% coverage in 2007)
- Hate crime supplemental survey administered to those police services not reporting to the UCR 2.2 survey
- Combined, coverage in 2006 and 2007 approximated 87% of the population of Canada
- Three hate crime questions:
  - 1. Indicator yes, suspected, no, unknown
    - <u>Definition</u>: criminal violation motivated by hate, based on race, national or ethnic origin, language, colour, religion, sex, age, mental or physical disability, sexual orientation or any other similar factor
  - 2. Type e.g. race/ethnicity, religion
  - 3. Detail e.g. Black, Arab, Asian, Aboriginal



#### Verification

- Edits are applied to electronic submissions
  - e.g. advocating genocide, public incitement of hatred must be scored as hate crimes
  - e.g. unknown responses are flagged for follow-up
- Supplemental questionnaires are reviewed manually and entered into an electronic database
- Databases are merged to create three databases
  - Incident, Victim and Accused
- Submissions are sent back to each police service for sign-off and consent for public release


#### Results

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- There were 795 hate crimes in 2007, 106 fewer than in 2006
- The 2007 rate of 2.7 per 100,000 population was 13% lower than in 2006
- Police-reported hate crimes account for less than 1% of all criminal incidents
- Most hate crimes (7 in 10) are non-violent and usually involve mischief (e.g. graffiti, vandalism)
- Hate crimes involving violence are usually minor in nature, e.g. common assault or uttering threats
- One homicide motivated by hate in 2007
- About one-third of all hate crimes in 2007 were committed by youth, double the proportion for crime in general
- Three primary motivations: race/ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation




## Hate crimes reported by police, by motivation, 2006 and 2007





## Racially-motivated hate crimes reported by police, by type of race, 2006 and 2007






## Hate crimes reported by police, by census metropolitan area, 2007
