


Robert Gould

As an example, he regularly performs his magic shows for developmentally-disabled adults, but will also do so for ordinary birthday parties and commercial activities provided they make a donation to local charities.

Robert has received many accolades over the years, but is especially proud of his Juno Award for contributing material to "Music Soup', which won Children's Album of the Year in 2008. Profits from this have benefitted many charities in Canada.
