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Entitlement to a Canadian Travel Document

Important Notice—We recommend that you not make any travel plans until you receive the requested travel document.

- Travel Document (United Nations Convention Relating to the Status of Refugees, 1951 and its Protocol of 1967): issued to persons in Canada with protected person status, including Convention refugees and persons in need of protection.
- Certificate of Identity: issued to permanent residents of Canada who are not yet Canadian citizens, who are stateless, or who are unable to obtain a national passport.

Warnings:

- Some countries may not accept the certificate of identity as a valid travel document. You should check with the consulate or embassy of the country the child will be visiting before applying for a certificate of identity.
- Travel documents and certificates of identity are not valid for travel to the bearer's country of citizenship.
- Persons 16 years of age or over must use form PPTC 190, Adult Travel Document Application.
- Eligibility for either a travel document or a certificate of identity can only be determined after all required information has been submitted and reviewed. These documents are issued only in Gatineau, Quebec.
- If the child is issued a Canadian travel document and the child later obtains a travel document or a passport issued by the child's country of citizenship, you **must** return the Canadian travel document issued in the name of the child to the Passport Canada Program—Citizenship and Immigration Canada.

Child's Personal Information

SURNAME AND GIVEN NAME(S) TO APPEAR IN TRAVEL DOCUMENT

Write the child's name as you want it to appear in the travel document. This name is normally the same as the surname (last name) and given name(s) shown on the child's proof of immigration status. If you are requesting a travel document in a name that is different from the name that appears on the child's immigration status document, **one (1)** of the following document will be required to confirm the child's change of name:

- a legal change of name order;
- · an adoption order; or
- a proof that the record of entry at Citizenship and Immigration Canada has been amended (i.e. approved "Request to Amend the Record of Landing or the Confirmation of Permanent Residence" form IMM 1436).

Additional documentation may be required to verify the child's identity.

SURNAME (LAST NAME) AT BIRTH/FORMER SURNAME (FORMER LAST NAME)


Complete if different from the surname (last name) to appear in the travel document (for the Passport Canada Program—Citizenship and Immigration Canada information only—will not appear in the travel document).

DATE OF BIRTH

The date of birth will be inscribed in the travel document exactly as it appears on the proof of immigration status unless Citizenship and Immigration Canada records have been amended subsequent to the child's admission to Canada. In this case, the original approved "Request to Amend the Record of Landing or the Confirmation of Permanent Residence" form IMM 1436 is required. If the child's proof of immigration status does not show a complete date of birth, indicate the specific **year**, **month** and **day** of the birth. Provide copies of any documents you may have showing this date of birth, i.e. provincial health card.

SIGNATURE

Children 11 years of age or over **must** sign their usual signature. The child's signature in section 1 will appear in the travel document. Therefore, the signature **must not** exceed the inner limits of the signature box.



Note: At no time, should a person other than the child sign in the signature box, section 1.



Who May Apply for a Travel Document on Behalf of a Child?

- · One of the parents
- The custodial parent in cases of separation or divorce; or
- The legal guardian



Information on Applicant and Proof of Parentage

Both parents are requested to participate in obtaining a travel document for their child and to sign the application form. The other parent may be contacted. Where a legal guardian is the applicant, the other legal guardian(s), as the case may be, is (are) also requested to participate. Proof of legal guardianship is required.

PARENTAGE LINK BETWEEN THE CHILD AND THE PARENT(S)

You must submit one of the following acceptable proof of parentage documents demonstrating the relationship between the child and the parent(s):

- a detailed birth certificate from the child's country of birth, indicating the name of the parent(s); or
- an order of adoption indicating the name of the adopting parent(s).

Exception: An application submitted on behalf of a child will be accepted without proof of parentage only if

- · A Canadian certificate of identity or Canadian travel document was previously issued to the child in his or her name; and
- the parent(s)/legal guardian(s) who participated in the previous application is (are) the same one(s) who is (are) participating in this application.

CUSTODY, SEPARATION AND DIVORCE

Where a court order or agreement exists referring to custody of the child, only the person with custodial rights may apply. All documents that refer to custody of, mobility of, or access to the child must be provided. If a divorce has been granted, a copy of the divorce judgment or order must also be provided. Where joint custody provisions exist, either parent may apply.

RELATIONSHIP WITH OTHER PARENT

Indicate your current relationship with the other parent: single (no relationship), common law, married, separated, divorced, widowed. Indicate date of marriage to the other parent, if applicable. Additional information or documentation may be required. Where a legal guardian is the applicant, proof or legal guardianship must be provided.



Proof of Immigration Status in Canada

Provide **one (1)** of the valid immigration status documents listed in section 3 of the application form (**original only**). It will be returned to you. A Notice of decision from the Immigration and Refugee Board of Canada or a Verification of status from Citizenship and Immigration Canada confirming the child's protected person status are acceptable documents. Additional information may be required to confirm the child's immigration status in Canada. If you require an immigration status document, contact Citizenship and Immigration Canada (see section F).



Declaration of Guarantor

A guarantor is a person other than the applicant who confirms the applicant's identity and has knowledge of the child.

The guarantor must:

- be a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident living in Canada;
- have known you (the applicant) personally for at least six (6) months*;
 - *To know an applicant personally means that the guarantor is able to confirm aspects of the applicant's personal attributes such as name, approximate age, place of birth, physical description and some personal history such as occupation and place of residence. A family member or person residing at the same address as you (the applicant) may be the guarantor provided that the individual meets the specified requirements.
- have known you well enough to be confident that the statements you have made in the application form are true;
- be included in one (1) of the following groups:
 - · dentist, medical doctor or chiropractor
 - judge, magistrate, police officer (municipal, provincial or RCMP)
 - · lawyer (member of a provincial bar association), notary in Quebec
 - mayor
 - minister of religion authorized under provincial or territorial law to perform marriages
 - · notary public
 - optometrist
 - pharmacist

- postmaster
- · principal of primary or secondary school
- professional accountant (member of APA, CA, CGA, CMA, PA or RPA)
- professional engineer (P. Eng., Eng. in Quebec)
- senior administrator in a community college (including CEGEP)
- senior administrator or teacher in a university
- veterinarian

The above list is not a recognition or endorsement by Passport Canada Program—Citizenship and Immigration Canada (PCPCIC) of professional status or superior qualifications.

• be accessible to the PCPCIC for verification.

The parent or legal guardian applying for a travel document for the child, cannot sign as guarantor. However, if applicable, the other parent or legal guardian of the child may sign as guarantor.

The guarantor must perform free of charge the following two (2) tasks:

- 1. Complete and sign the Declaration of Guarantor section (ensure you have completed and signed all **four (4)** pages of the application before submitting it to your guarantor).
- 2. Write "I certify this to be a true likeness of (child's name)" on the back of one (1) of the child's photos, and sign it.

PCPCIC reserves the right to request an alternate guarantor.

The applicant must not assist the guarantor in performing his or her duties. If your guarantor requires assistance, contact the PCPCIC.

If you **have not known** an eligible guarantor for at least **six (6)** months, complete form PPTC 326, *Statutory Declaration in Lieu of Guarantor for a Travel Document*, available from any Passport Canada Program regional office or contact the PCPCIC (see section H). This form must be completed at your expense before a person authorized by law to administer an oath or solemn affirmation.

This may delay the processing time of the travel document.



Previous Canadian Travel Document

- Enclose any valid Canadian certificate of identity or Canadian refugee travel document issued to the child. If the child's current travel document is valid for more than 12 months from the date the application is submitted, provide a written explanation as to why you are applying at this time. Should Passport Canada Program—Citizenship and Immigration Canada (PCPCIC) not be satisfied that you have a valid reason for applying early, your application for a new travel document may be refused.
- A person's name may appear in only one (1) valid Canadian certificate of identity or Canadian refugee travel document.

Note: If a valid Canadian travel document has been lost, stolen, damaged or is inaccessible, complete form PPTC 203, *Declaration*, available online at passportcanada.gc.ca. A Canadian certificate of identity or Canadian refugee travel document, once reported lost or stolen, is no longer valid. If found, it is not to be used for travel and must be returned immediately to PCPCIC or if abroad to the nearest Government of Canada office.



Citizenship and Travel Documentation

- Enclose any valid or expired foreign travel document or national passport issued to the child or in which the child's name appears. If you are no longer in possession of this travel document or passport, write on the application form a description of the document, date and place of issue and explain its present whereabouts. If the document has been seized by Citizenship and Immigration Canada, provide the *Notice of Seizure* (IMM 5265).
- If the child has visited another country since his or her entry to Canada, write the date or dates he or she left Canada, the date or dates he or she returned and explain the reason for the visit (if insufficient space, use section 9 (Notes) of the application form).
- If the child has been refused a national passport, enclose the letter of refusal. If this letter is not in either English or French, you must submit a translation of the document done by a certified translator.
- If the child has been refused a national passport and you have not received a letter of refusal from the authorities to whom the application was made, enclose copies of any relevant letters you may have retained regarding the request for a passport or renewal of such a document for the child. Write on the application form the results of the application including the date you were refused (if insufficient space, use section 9 (Notes) of the application form).
- If you have applied for a national passport for the child and have not received a written response, write in detail on the application form all the steps you have taken (by order of date) to obtain the passport and the results achieved. Enclose copies of any relevant letters you may have retained (if insufficient space, use section 9 (Notes) of the application form).



Application for Canadian Citizenship

- If you have lost your child's Canadian citizenship receipt, write the date the application was made.
- If you were unsuccessful in your child's application for Canadian citizenship, enclose the letter of refusal. If you have lost the letter of refusal, write the date you applied and the reason for the refusal.

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Privacy Notice Statement



All personal information provided on this application form is collected by the Passport Canada Program—Citizenship and Immigration Canada (PCPCIC) for the purpose of determining entitlement of the child to a Canadian travel document and to provide information to the Consular Operations Bureau of Foreign Affairs, Trade and Development Canada in the event that the travel document holder requires assistance while travelling abroad. In the performance of those services, the personal information is collected, used and disclosed under the authority of the Canadian Passport Order and in accordance with the Privacy Act and any other federal laws, regulations and policies applicable to the protection of personal information, as described in Personal Information Bank PPTC PPD 101 (Certificate of Identity and Refugee Travel Documents). In the context of the delivery of travel document services, the PCPCIC and other federal government institutions or Government of Canada offices abroad assisting in the delivery of travel document services may exchange personal information. In addition, in determining current and ongoing entitlement and to maintain the integrity of the passport program, all personal information collected is subject to verification and security queries to authenticate identity and citizenship, as well as to identify the existence of grounds for refusal to issue a travel document, the revocation of a currently valid travel document or the refusal of travel document services. In the same context, the guarantor's personal information is also subject to verification and security queries to determine whether the individual meets the guarantor requirements. Personal information may be disclosed to third party entities, such as law enforcement authorities and identity document issuing institutions, for verification and security queries required in the delivery of travel document services. Personal information may also be disclosed by third-party entities to PCPCIC or other federal government institutions or Government of Canada offices abroad for those same purposes. To strengthen the security of the Canadian travel document, PCPCIC uses facial recognition technology. Also, an electronic chip is inserted into the booklet. The chip contains, in electronic format, the photo of the bearer and the personal information (excluding the signature) found on page 2 of the booklet.

Rules for Canadian Travel Document Photos

Note: Photo specifications for the travel document are different from those for a permanent resident card. You must submit two (2) identical photos with each Canadian travel document application.

THE PHOTOS MUST

- · be taken by a commercial photographer;
- be clear, sharp and in focus. Photos may be in colour or in black and white:
- have a neutral facial expression (eyes open and clearly visible, mouth closed, no smiling);
- have uniform lighting—no shadows, glare or flash reflections;
- be taken straight on with the face and shoulders centered and squared to the camera:
- be taken in front of a plain white or light-coloured background to clearly distinguish the person from the background. Photos must reflect/ represent natural skin tones;
- be originals that have not been altered in any way or taken from an existing photo;
- reflect the current appearance of the child (taken within the last 12
- be professionally printed on plain, high quality photographic paper (photos printed at home and photos printed on heavy weight paper are not acceptable).

- The name and complete address of the photo studio and the date the photo was taken. The photographer may use a stamp or handwrite this information (stick-on labels are not acceptable).
- The guarantor's signature.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- · Glasses, including tinted prescription glasses, may be worn in photos as long as the eyes are clearly visible and there is no glare in the glasses. Sunglasses and the red-eye effect are unacceptable.
- Hats and head coverings must not be worn, unless worn for religious beliefs or medical reasons. However, the head covering must not cast shadows on the face and the full face must be clearly visible.

CHILD PHOTOS

- The above rules apply equally to photos of children;
- The photo must show the child's head and shoulders only. The hands of the parent or child must not appear in the photo.
- The Passport Canada Program—Citizenship and Immigration Canada recognizes that it is difficult to obtain a neutral expression from a newborn and will be tolerant in this respect.
- If applying for a one-time replacement passport for a child, you must include a photo that was taken within one month of the date the application is submitted.

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Travelling with Children or Children Travelling Alone



Immigration authorities in most countries are becoming increasingly vigilant when children cross international borders. Whether travelling alone or accompanied by an adult, each child travelling abroad must have an individual valid travel document or passport and may also require supporting documentation. Prior to any travel, you should contact the embassy or consulate of all countries the child will be visiting to inquire about entry requirements.

Documentation to Facilitate Travel Abroad



The following documents may be required to support the entry of a child to another country:

- Birth certificate showing the names of both parents.
- · Documents pertaining to custody.
- If the child is travelling with one parent, a letter signed and dated from the other parent authorizing travel (letter may have to be notarized).
- If the child is travelling with someone other than the parent, a letter signed and dated from both parents authorizing travel with that person (letter may have to be notarized).
- If the child is travelling alone, a letter signed and dated from both parents authorizing travel (letter may have to be notarized).
- If one of the parents is deceased, the death certificate.

Documentation and Tips to Facilitate the Return to Canada



The following tips may help to avoid delays when a child is returning to Canada:

- Make sure you carry proper identification for yourself and any children travelling with you to assist in confirming your legal right or authorization to enter Canada upon your return.
- · If you have custody of the child, carry copies of documents specifying custody rights to the child.
- If you are not the legal guardian of the child, carry a letter of permission or authorization for you to have custody when entering Canada. When a parent is travelling alone with a child, a letter from the other parent can also facilitate the return of both the parent and the child. The letter should also contain telephone numbers where the parent or legal guardian can be contacted.
- If you are travelling with a group, ensure you are in the same vehicle as the child you are accompanying when arriving at a border crossing.
- Have the child memorize a telephone number to call in an emergency.

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Custody Information

• Custody arrangements in Canada may not be recognized in another country. In extreme cases, the child may not be able to leave the country visited. It is recommended that, before leaving on a trip, you check with the embassy or consulate of the country or countries the child will be visiting to determine the documentation that may be required relating to custody of the child.
