Target audience: Grades 5 and 6

Duration: 1 hour

A mysterious organization has altered the course of history. Help us solve the mystery! Based on the famous board game Clue, our educational program allows students to search the State rooms of the residence of the governor general for clues to help them solve a mystery. An educational, interactive and fun experience!

In this mission, Lord Elgin is unable to establish a system of responsible government in Canada. As they explore the State rooms, students will be required to perform special tasks to help him re-establish the course of history.

This activity helps students improve their knowledge of the British period, from 1760 to 1867. In conclusion, they will be able to list the events that led to the establishment of the system of government we know today, and to define the role of various Canadian institutions, such as the Crown, the Queen, the governor general and the prime minister.
