Target audience: Secondary I and II (Grades 7 and 8)

Duration: 1 hour

A mysterious organization has altered the course of history. Help us solve the mystery! Based on the famous board game Clue, our educational program allows students to search the State rooms of the residence of the governor general for clues to help them solve a mystery. An educational, interactive and fun experience!

In this mission, a mysterious organization has stolen a very important document! This is very serious because the stolen document authorizes the governor general of Canada to exercise powers and responsibilities belonging to the Sovereign, on the advice of the Privy Council. His Excellency the Right Honourable David Johnston needs your help! You must find this document in one of the State rooms. Could it be in the Ballroom? Or maybe in the Frontenac Dining Room?

By examining period photographs and historical documents, students will discover the key events that shaped Canada's democracy, from 1608 until today. They will also learn about the responsibilities carried out by the governor general of Canada today.
