

Screenwriter in Residence Sugith Varughese April 21 – June 14, 2008

North York Central Library welcomes Sugith Varughese as Toronto Public Library Screenwriter in Residence from April 21st to June 14th. Sugith has been writing professionally in Canada for over 25 years. He is on the faculty of Humber College's School of Creative and Performing Arts and has extensive experience in teaching screenwriting in both academic and workshop settings. As an actor and director, as well as a screenwriter, Sugith brings a wealth of insider knowledge to his residency.

Submissions

Submissions must be finished scripts for any of:

- Short Films (under 20 pages in screenplay format)
- ½ hour teleplays (22 28 pages in screenplay format, 40 – 45 pages in sitcom format)
- 1 hour teleplays (45 50 pages in screenplay format)
- Full-length screenplays (UNDER 120 pages in screenplay format)
- Treatments (UNDER 60 pages double spaced)

Writers must be 16 years of age or older and scripts must be submitted by the author of the work.

Include your name, address, e-mail address, and telephone number. There is a limit of one script per person. Scripts will be accepted up until May 2, space permitting.

Sugith Varughese will meet with participants to discuss their work. The library will make every effort to accommodate all those who submit work, but it may not be possible to provide everyone with an interview.

Participants whose scripts are accepted will have an opportunity to participate in a two part workshop led by Sugith Varughese that will outline the next steps after a first draft script is completed

Interviews are by appointment only.
