Dear Mr. Traversy,

Re: Part 1 Application 2012-1243-0; Shaw Inc. (Shaw) request for amendment of commitments relating to tangible benefits

- The Writers Guild of Canada (the WGC) is the national association representing over 2000 professional screenwriters working in English-language film, television, radio and digital media production in Canada. The WGC is actively involved in advocating for a strong and vibrant Canadian broadcasting system containing high-quality Canadian programming.
- 2. The WGC wishes to oppose Shaw's proposal to re-allocate the remaining \$2.4 million in tangible benefits connected with Broadcasting Decision CRTC 2007-429. Specifically, we direct our comments to the proposed reallocation from "pilot projects for scripted drama and other priority programming" to "scripted drama production".
- 3. The pilot project plays a crucial role in the development of television series. Production is expensive and the pilot helps networks determine whether a series is viable before committing a considerable amount of time and money towards numerous episodes. The limited scale of a pilot enables productions to test all components including story, script, performances, production design, wardrobe, location, visual effects and audience reaction among a myriad other elements. Getting it right early is the smart way to create well-crafted, efficiently produced stories. If Shaw's pilot-related benefits were reallocated to a later stage, this would remove an important instrument of risk management from the production of new television series.

- 4. The WGC respectfully requests that the Commission instructs Shaw to maintain the benefits within the pilot projects initiative.
