

HIV/AIDS and Hepatitis C are viruses that have affected communities throughout the world. Travelers into and out of Inuit communities must understand that although Inuit communities are generally small and isolated, these viruses might be present.

Travelers also need to understand that these viruses represent a serious threat to the health and well being of Inuit and Inuit communities. All visitors and community members are asked to take the necessary steps to prevent the spread of these viruses and other sexually transmitted infections among Inuit.

HIV/AIDS/HEPATITIS C

HIV is a virus that attacks the immune system and results in AIDS. No cure or vaccine exists for HIV/AIDS.

Hepatitis C (Hep C) is a virus that damages the liver. Although some treatments are available, there is no cure or vaccine for Hep C.

HIV and Hep C are most often spread through contact with the blood or body fluids of people who have been infected with these viruses. Many people who are living with HIV or Hep C look healthy and may not know that they have either virus.

Protecting yourself against HIV or Hep C is your responsibility.

GET THE FACTS

While HIV and Hep C can be transmitted in a number of ways, the most common ways are through unprotected sex (sex without a condom) and/or sharing needles and other equipment for drug use.

SHOW YOU CARE

HIV, AIDS and Hep C are dangerous viruses, but they cannot be spread by:

- talking
- shaking hands
- kissing
- hugging
- sharing bathrooms with someone who is infected with these viruses.

Pitsâtailillutit imminik tamakkunangat Kanimmasinit HIV amma Tingullusik C tamanna kisivit igvit piusigigumagunni pisot. Sutagga HIV Kanimmasik amma Tingullusik C aunni amma timippit imanginnejuk, attutailigiaKavutit timingita imanginnik asippit inob.

Sollu igvit amet attuipat asippit aunganut, pimmagiuvuk ubvasiallu gu attuvinga, atullutit ugvautimik amma nigungittumik imammik tagvainammagik.

A SELF PROTECTION ISSUE

Protecting yourself against HIV and Hep C infection is something only you can choose to do. Because HIV and Hep C live in blood and body fluids, you should avoid contact with the body fluids of another person.

If your skin comes in contact with some else's blood, it is very important to wash that area very well, using soap and warm water as soon as possible.

AVOIDING INFECTION

Any activity that puts you in contact with someone's body fluids, especially their blood is a risk for a number of infections.

Piercing, tattooing and games like chicken or torture put people at risk of infection for HIV and Hep C.

- Do not share needles for any purpose
- Be careful when using knives or other sharp objects
- Do not share razors, tooth brushes, pop bottles or anything else that could possibly have blood on it.

PROTECT YOURSELF AGAINST THESE VIRUSES

Sollu aippakagumatoguvit, allât sollu atausimik tapsumingatsainak aippakatsainaguvit, atullutit pommik piunippauvuk aittauttailiniagavit piungiliudjaugiamut HIV Kanimmasinganik, Tingullusik C amma asinginnik aippagedlutik aittunattunik Kanimmassinik.

- Atullutit kisiani imalinnik mingugutinnik taipsumani atuliguvit ponnik. KY piujuk atugianga tagvainak nagvatausok.

IF YOU ARE SEXUALLY ACTIVE


If you are sexually active, even if you have one regular partner, using condoms is your best protection against infection with HIV, Hep C and other sexually transmitted diseases.

Keep in mind that:

- Only latex condoms provide protection.
- Condoms expire so remember to check the date to make sure that they are good.
- Read the instructions and make sure that you are using the condom correctly. Condoms fail most often because men do not put them on correctly.
- Use only water based lubricants when you use a condom. KY is a good choice and it is easily available.

Kanimmasik taijak Chlamydia amma gonorrhea sakKisainaluattok STD-ni Inuit nunalitu Kauvinginnut. Sollu tamakkua Kanimmaset anniasuttaungipata, ajunnasimmagigajattut allât nukKasittisillutik (nutagattâtitsigunnaqunnailutik).

HTLV-1 (Human T-cell Lymphotropic Virus, Type 1) Tamna taimâk taijak Kallunâtut ejanut Kanimmasisak akItaugunnangituk aittunattodluni Kaujijausimajuk ilanginni nunakkatigeni Nunavutmi. HTLV -1 Kanimmasiclummagik allât kancerittâtitsik aummut amma/ugvalu Kanimmasiugiasiok ippiniagiutinganik timitta. Sollu HIV, HTLV-1 siammatisisok pitâttailijuKangippat aippagennimut amma/ugvalu atuguvit tapsumingatsainak kapotimmik ammalu asinginnik kapotennik atuguvit atuttaugetainnatunik.

OTHER SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED DISEASES (STDs)

Chlamydia and gonorrhea are the most common STDs in Inuit communities. If these diseases are not treated, serious problems can develop that can result in sterility (not being able to have children).

HTLV-1 (Human T-cell Lymphotropic Virus, Type 1) is a sexually transmitted virus that has been detected in some communities in Nunavut. HTLV-1 is a serious disease that can cause cancer of the blood and/or a disease of the nervous system. Like HIV, HTLV-1 is spread through unprotected sex and/or sharing needles and other injecting equipment.

Tamângunitsak ajunnaluaKattatuk inunnut atuKattatunut imialummik ejalukannilu piungilitisik isumaKatsiagiamut ammalu tukiKagasuannimut. Imigannik ejalukaillu anajanaluuattuk aittunattutâttailigasuannimut angutik annalonnet tamakkunangat HIV, Tingullusik C amma asinginnit STD Kanimmasinginnit.

Imialuk amma pitsanginnitsisongummijuk piusinganik timitta amma pitâsonguluuanilittilugu akItaugunnangitunik ejanut (Kanimmasinik) sollu HIV amma Tingullusik C itâjanninginnut igvit timinnut.

Imialuk amma piungilitisisongummijuk igvit tingunnik piungitummagimmik sakKititsidluni piluattukut sollu igvit pitaKaguvit Tingullusik C-mik. Ammalugiak, imigannik imialummik nutagatsaKallutit kajusitisik Piungilitisinsimmik nutagatsagijannik Kalunâtut taijak Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD).

ALCOHOL AND DRUGS

It is often more difficult for people who use alcohol and drugs to think clearly and rationally. Drinking and drug use make it less likely that a person will protect him or herself from HIV, Hep C and other STDs.

Alcohol also weakens your immune system and makes it easier for viruses (germs) like HIV and Hep C to enter your body.

Alcohol also causes damage to your liver that can cause serious problems especially if you have Hep C. Also, drinking alcohol while pregnant is the direct cause of Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD).

SEXUAL ASSAULT IS AN ACT OF VIOLENCE

No one has the right to force you to have sex against your will. The risk of HIV infection increases in situations of sexual assault if the attacker has HIV and their blood or sperm enters your body.

Men who sexually assault are less likely to use a condom when they rape and intercourse is usually more violent.

If you have been sexually assaulted, report it immediately to the police and go to the local hospital or health center.

RAPE IS A CRIME

Kuninnianik, Kuittuning amma atuKataunnik sollu sikarenik ugvalu kigutinnut salummasaigutinnik pitaKappata Kanimmasinnik ilagijangit aittutaugiamut imagalanginnik Kagitait Kanimmasinik siammatigiangit kinamit kinamut.

MENINGOCOCCAL DISEASE

Meningococcal disease is an infection of the fluid around the brain. The most serious form of meningococcal disease can result in serious, permanent disabilities or death.

Kissing, coughing and sharing objects such as cigarettes or toothbrushes that may have mouth germs on them are some of the ways that Meningococcal disease is spread from one person to another.

Protect yourself! Don't share anything that may have someone else's mouth germs on it and cover your mouth when you cough or sneeze.

If you have been in contact with someone who has Meningococcal disease or meningitis, go to your doctor, nurse or health centre right away.

TB is an infection caused by
bacteria that most often
affects the lungs. It is spread
when a person with TB
coughs or sneezes into the air.


The risk of catching TB is
greater when people live or
stay in crowded conditions,
when they do not eat a
balanced diet and when they
have conditions like HIV that
weaken their immune system.

with lots of soap and warm
water
