**Births**

2010

Released by Statistics Canada – September 26, 2012

**Background:**

In 2010, the number of births in Nunavut was **828**. This is a **decrease** from 2009 of **49** babies, or **5.6%**.

Canadian births decreased by **1.0%** over the same period.
