## Topic:Hours worked and labour productivity2010 (preliminary)Released by Statistics Canada – November 23, 2011

**Background:** Labour productivity in Nunavut rose by **11.5%** in 2010, the strongest growth in Canada. Output and hours worked also rose sharply in 2010, mainly the result of the new gold mine and associated activities.

By comparison, Canada's labour productivity rose by **1.9%** over the same period.
