Topic:Employment Insurance (EI)August (preliminary)Released by Statistics Canada – October 18, 2012

Background: In August 2012, an estimated **540** people received regular Employment Insurance (EI) benefits in Nunavut. This is an increase of **12.5%** from August 2011.

In Canada, the number of people receiving regular EI benefits decreased by **6.6%** over the same period.
