Topic: **Employment Insurance (EI)**
February 2017 (preliminary)
Released by Statistics Canada – April 20, 2017

Background: In February 2017, an estimated **550** people received regular Employment Insurance (EI) benefits in Nunavut. This is an **increase** of **25.0%** or **110 people** from February 2016. In Canada, the number of people receiving regular EI benefits **decreased** by **0.3%** over the same period.

- Number of people receiving regular EI benefits excludes claimants receiving training, job creation, self-employment benefits and other employment and support measures. EI statistics indicate the number of people who received EI benefits and should not be confused with Labour Force Survey data, which gives the total number of unemployed persons.
- All EI data series have been the subject of an historical revision going back to January 1997.
