**Topic:** Job Vacancy and Wage Survey

Third Quarter 2016

Released by Statistics Canada – January 25, 2017

**Background:** In Nunavut, there were **340** job vacancies during the third quarter of 2016.

The wage offered for vacant positions varied notably by province and territory with Nunavut (\$32.60) and the Northwest Territories (\$25.30) having

the highest wages offered, followed by Ontario (\$20.80).
