

Topic Police-Reported Crime Statistics

2011

Released by Statistics Canada – July 24, 2012

Background

In 2011, Nunavut's Total Crime Severity Index was **326.1** down by **6%** from 2010. The Violent Crime Severity Index was **469.3** down by **8%** from the previous year. As in previous years, Nunavut and the Northwest Territories continue to report the highest Crime Severity Index values.

By comparison, Canada's Total and Violent Crime Severity Indexes were **77.6** and **85.3** in 2011.

The police-reported crime rate and the Crime Severity Index (CSI) are complementary measures of crime. The crime rate measures the volume of crime reported to the police, while the Crime Severity Index measures the seriousness of crime.
