Topic:Youth Correctional Services2015/2016Released by Statistics Canada – March 1, 2017

Background: In 2015/2016, the total number of youth admissions to correctional services in Nunavut, was 44 admissions down by 18.5% from 2014/2015. Admissions to custody went down 26.7%, while admissions to community supervision decreased by 35.5%.
