To the Joint Review Panel Secretariat - DGR,

I initially submitted a written-only piece back in July of 2013 for the purpose of supporting the DGR project whole-heartedly, and I want to convey even stronger support today. In that submission I mentioned I didn't like using the term waste; I would prefer to use the term by-products. These legacy by-products must be dealt with in a way that is not only safe for the environment, but fiscally responsible for the people of Ontario. The funds are set aside for the long-term management of these by-products so we don't further burden future generations with its disposal. The science behind this project is extensive and much of it has been peer-reviewed. I believe the Bruce site is the best location for the DGR because most of the by-products are already on site here; and more than half of the future by-products will be produced here as well. The safety record at OPG is proven. OPG has safely managed this by-product for almost 5 decades, and I have faith that safety culture will extend to the long-term management of the low and intermediate level waste in the DGR.
