Thank you for your response to the June 18, 2013 letter from the Joint Review Panel inviting the Ministry of Aboriginal Affairs to participate in the DGR public hearing. The Panel understands that the Ministry of Aboriginal Affairs does not have a legislative, regulatory or approval role in relation to the DGR project and accepts that the Ministry does not plan to make a presentation at the hearing.

You previously informed the Panel that your mandate is to promote collaboration and coordination across government on Aboriginal policy and programs (registry Doc #533). Further, the Panel has just been made aware of the January 2010 Agreement between Ontario as represented by the former Minister of Energy and Infrastructure and the Saugeen Ojibway Nations in relation to energy matters.
