PROCURED PPE (for shipping to 135 countries)



- 1 million goggles
- 4 million gowns
- 8 million face shields
- 19 million N-95 respirators
- 37 million gloves
- 175 million medical masks

SOLIDARITY TRIALS



- 3500 patients enrolled
- More than 100 countries joined
- >400 hospitals in 33 countries
- 160 candidate vaccines:
 - 21 in clinical evaluation
 - 139 pre-clinical evaluation

PARTNERS PLATFORM



- 153 countries on-boarded
- 125+ countries active
- 108 national plans uploaded
- 102 checklists started/done
- 82 resource requests
- 592 donor contributions from 70 donors

STRENGTHENED LABORATORY, TREATMENT CAPACITY AND BIOMEDICAL EQUIPMENT



- 14 000 oxygen concentrators allocated to 120+ countries
- 9 800 pulse oximeters & consumables
- 6 million polymerase chain reaction (PCR) tests
- 5.2 million sample collection kits procured
