Product has a Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS)		
The product label clearly indicates the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• the product name</li> <li>• the product's intended use</li> <li>• a quantitative statement of active ingredient(s)</li> <li>• the area and site of use</li> <li>• specific directions for use, including the specific types of surfaces/instruments to be cleaned/sanitized</li> <li>• the dilution or activation procedure(s) required, if any</li> <li>• the mode of application</li> <li>• minimum contact time with the item(s) to be cleaned/sanitized</li> <li>• cleaning and rinsing procedures</li> <li>• the temperature for use</li> <li>• the reuse period</li> <li>• disposal instructions (e.g., sewer, hazardous waste)</li> <li>• appropriate precautionary symbols and statements</li> <li>• first aid instruction</li> </ul>		
The product meets cleaner/sanitizer criteria, i.e., reduction of vegetative bacterial strains by more than 5 log <sub>10</sub> in the presence of 5% bovine serum		
The product is not corrosive		
The product is compatible with BOTH the equipment/surface's manufacturer's instruction and with the existing disinfecting products being used for the equipment/surface		
Information on the required personal protective equipment (PPE), if any, is provided		
Product has a long shelf life/expiry date (usage factors and size of product container are factors to consider)		
Product is safe to transport		
Product is easy to store		
Product is non-toxic to humans and animals
