



INFORMATION FOR CANDIDATES SEEKING APPOINTMENT TO EDITORIAL BOARD OF CANADIAN JOURNAL OF INFECTION CONTROL

The Canadian Journal of Infection Control (CJIC) is seeking two candidates to complete the current CJIC Editorial Board. The responsibility of the Editorial Board is to critique submitted articles and return the evaluation to the Editor-in-Chief within the established time lines. There are usually four journal issues per year. It is anticipated that each Editorial Board member may review up to four submissions per year.

The preferred candidates are a licensed and practicing MD and/or PhD with expertise in: MD: Infectious Diseases, Medical Microbiology, Public Health or Community Medicine PhD: Nursing, Epidemiology, Biostatistics, Microbiology, Public Health or a related discipline

The term of the Editorial Board is five years. The new Editorial Board members will each have a term expiring December 31, 2020. A selection committee comprised of the Editor-in-Chief, IPAC Canada President, and one other IPAC Canada Board member will review each candidate's application using the IPAC Canada Scoring Tool for the Editorial Board of CJIC (IPAC Policy Form 19). It is suggested that candidates review the policy before submitting their application. http://www.ipac-canada.org/Members/policies/Form19coverpage.pdf The appointment of candidates for CJIC Editorial Board is to be ratified by the Board of Directors. A Conflict of Interest Form must be signed by each successful candidate.

QUALIFICATIONS:

Applicants must possess the following qualifications and agree to the following terms:

- Must be a current (2015) member of IPAC Canada, having held membership for at least 3 years;
- Has specialty training in Infectious Diseases, Public Health, Microbiology, Epidemiology, Biostatistics, Community Medicine or a related discipline.
- Certification in Infection Control & Epidemiology (CIC) is preferred.
- Maintains a current license and is practicing in one or more of the specialty areas.
- Must have a minimum of 5 years' experience in the specialty area.
- Must have demonstrated strong organization and communication skills;
- Must have the time, personal commitment and support of their institution to serve IPAC Canada through this position.

APPLICATION MUST INCLUDE:

- A letter from applicant demonstrating suitability for the position plus a list of publications and lectures.
- A resume that includes details as to the candidate's background in Infection Prevention and Control/Infectious Diseases.
- A letter from the candidate's Director indicating support of the candidate.
