# Is Entrepreneurship Right for You? Think You Are Ready to Run a Food and Beverage Business?

# **Food and Beverage Business Self Assessment**

Take a few minutes to learn more about the reality of being your own boss and what it takes to succeed. Here are some key self assessment questions to consider before deciding to become an entrepreneur:

- 1. What are the main reasons I want to start a food business?
- 2. What are the pros and cons of starting a food business?
- 3. Do I have the personal and business skills and knowledge to take on the challenges and opportunities that becoming an entrepreneur will require and if not, am I willing to seek out the necessary advice and skills?
- 4. Does my personality suit the entrepreneur lifestyle that often includes waiting several years to see a return on investment?
- 5. If necessary, am I prepared to lower my standard of living to start the business?
- 6. Is this the right time to start a new business based on my lifestyle?
- 7. Am I prepared to work long hours and weekends?
- 8. Do I have adequate financial resources to support the development, start-up, and operation of a food and beverage business? If not, where am I going to source or generate the necessary funds?
- 9. What is my risk tolerance for starting a new business?

- 10. Have I discussed my business idea and business plan with an advisor and considered any advice?
- 11. Do my family and/or friends support my business idea, and will they support me in becoming an entrepreneur?
- 12. Have I conducted a thorough market and industry research to improve the chances that my business idea is successful and profitable? Have I market tested my product or idea?



## **Steps for Starting a new Food and Beverage Business**

Once you decide that you are ready to be an entrepreneur and you have a product idea you want to sell, here are some steps to think about before starting.

- 1. Identify your product's features and competitive advantages
- 2. Conduct relevant market research
- Develop a business plan and marketing strategy
- 4. Set up your business
  - Choose the most appropriate business structure (e.g. sole proprietorship, partnership, incorporated)
  - Name and register your business
  - · Obtain liability and insurance
- 5. Secure financing for the food and beverage business
- 6. Develop your product
  - Ensure the product meets all requirements to be sold including regulations, shelf life, and consumer acceptance
- 7. Determine how and where the product will be manufactured
  - Determine if any permits, licences, inspections, additional labour or specific equipment is required
- 8. Ensure the product and process will meet all food safety requirements and regulations
- 9. Ensure the package will protect the product and the label meets all regulatory requirements
- 10. Develop marketing and promotional strategies to sell your product
- 11. Choose suitable distribution channels to sell your product
