

# COVID Alert app: Spread the word

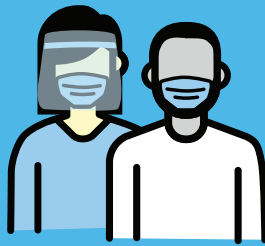
As trusted frontline workers, you have an important role to play in promoting COVID Alert. This public health tool can help limit the spread of COVID-19 and relieve stress on Canada's healthcare system.

## How public health workers can help



### Download the app

Get to know how it works. The app can be turned off when wearing personal protective equipment.



### Recommend the app

Mention the app and encourage others to download it.



### Provide one-time keys

When confirming positive test results, provide a one-time key and advise people to enter it into the app.



### Follow up

Mention the app in every follow-up call and remind people to enter their one-time key.

## Explaining how the app works

The app uses Bluetooth signals to exchange random codes with nearby phones that have the app.

If someone you've come in close\* contact with later tests positive for COVID-19, they will receive a one-time key from their local health authority that they can enter into the app.

You and others who have spent time near\* this person will then be notified through the app that you may have been exposed.



## If someone tests positive

They will receive a one-time key, through their local public health unit.

Information on how to access a one-time key, can also be found within the app by clicking "Get a one-time key".

Once the one-time key is entered into the app, other users who have been close\* to them will be anonymously notified that they may have been exposed.



\*For more than 15 minutes, less than 2 metres apart, in the last 14 days



## User privacy is protected

COVID Alert does not have access to a user's location, name or address, or their health information.
