AMENDMENT LOTTERY SCHEMES ORDER

Pursuant to section 207 of the Criminal Code of Canada, R.S.C. 1985, Chap. C.-46, Council made the following order:

1. The Criminal Code of Canada Lottery Schemes Order (EC884/84) is amended by the addition of the following after section 4.3:

2. This order comes into force on September 17, 2005.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

This amendment adds a provision to the Lottery Schemes Order to authorize the issuance of a license to PEI (Satellite) Bingo Association Inc. to operate satellite bingos. It establishes prize limits, service charge limits and age limits for satellite bingo games.

2. Section 3 of the Schedule is revoked.**3. These regulations come into force on August 27, 2005.****EXPLANATORY NOTES**

The amendment removes a fee exempted for farmers and commercial fishers. Farmers and commercial fishers, when purchasing an angling license, are now required to pay the prescribed fee.

(2) Every person who obtains a license or a permit for angling, hunting or trapping pursuant to the *Wildlife Conservation Act* or any regulations made or continued under the Act, shall pay a Wildlife Conservation Fund fee

(a) in the amount of \$12.15 where the person is 65 years of age or older; or

(b) in the amount of \$18.69 where the person is between 16 and 65 years of age.

2. These regulations come into force on August 27, 2005.**EXPLANATORY NOTES**

The amendment increases the Wildlife Conservation Fund fee from \$12.15 to \$18.69 for persons between 16 and 65 years of age.
