

**EC2019-765****HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACT  
DRIVER'S LICENSES REGULATIONS  
AMENDMENT**

Pursuant to section 69 of the *Highway Traffic Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. H-5, Council made the following regulations:

**1. Section 1 of the *Highway Traffic Act* Driver's Licenses Regulations (EC550/02) is amended**

**(a) in subclause (d)(iii), by the deletion of the word "taxi" and the substitution of the words "taxicab or motor vehicle used in a ride-sharing service";**

**(b) by renumbering it as subsection 1(1); and**

**(c) by the addition of the following after subsection (1):**

(2) In this section, "ride-sharing service" means an arrangement in which a passenger travels in a motor vehicle, usually for a fee and arranged by means of a website or mobile application. Definition "ride-sharing service"

(3) Despite clause (1)(d), the Registrar may issue a Class 4 driver's license that is restricted to the operation of Class 4 driver's license

(a) any motor vehicle which the holder of a Class 5, 8 and 9 may operate; and

(b) any taxicab or motor vehicle used in a ride-sharing service.

**2. These regulations come into force on December 2, 2019.****EXPLANATORY NOTES**

**SECTION 1** authorizes the holder of a Class 4 driver's license to operate any taxicab or motor vehicle used in a ride-sharing service in addition to the other types of vehicles specified in the provision in respect of a Class 4 driver's license. The section also provides a definition for "ride-sharing service" and authorizes the Registrar to issue a Class 4 driver's license that is restricted to the operation of any motor vehicle which the holder of a Class 5, 8 and 9 driver's license may operate, and any taxicab or motor vehicle used in a ride-sharing service.

**SECTION 2** provides for the commencement of the regulations.

**ISLAND INVESTMENT DEVELOPMENT ACT  
FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE REGULATIONS  
KINGS SQUARE AFFORDABLE HOUSING CORPORATION  
AUTHORIZATION**

Pursuant to subsection 2(3) of the *Island Investment Development Act* Financial Assistance Regulations (EC2005-686), Council authorized Island Investment Development Inc. to provide a bridge financing loan in the maximum amount of six million (\$6,000,000.00) dollars at a rate of four (4%) percent to Kings Square Affordable Housing Corporation for the purchase of capital assets, on terms and conditions satisfactory to the Board of Directors of Island Investment Development Inc.

**MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT ACT  
CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS AND ELECTION EXPENSES  
BYLAW REGULATIONS  
AMENDMENT**

Pursuant to section 36 of the *Municipal Government Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. M-12.1, Council made the following regulations:

**1. Subsection 8(2) of the Campaign Contributions and Election Expenses Bylaw Regulations (EC399/18) is amended by the deletion of the words “a registered charity of the candidate’s choice” and the substitution of the words “a charity of the candidate’s choice that is registered under the *Income Tax Act* (Canada)”.**

**2. These regulations come into force on November 23, 2019.**

**EXPLANATORY NOTES**

**SECTION 1** amends subsection 8(2) of the Campaign Contributions and Election Expenses Bylaw Regulations (EC399/18) to clarify that the words “registered charity” mean a charity registered under the *Income Tax Act* (Canada).

**SECTION 2** provides for the commencement of the regulations.

**EC2019-768****PROVINCE OF PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND  
ESTIMATES OF CAPITAL EXPENDITURE  
FISCAL YEAR 2020-2021**

This Council in Committee, having under consideration the Estimates of Capital Expenditure required to carry on the Public Service of the Province for the Fiscal Year ending March 31, 2021, and amounting in all to the sum of One Hundred and Fifty-Five Million, Seven Hundred and Sixty-Seven Thousand, Two Hundred Dollars (\$155,767,200), together with a sum sufficient for similar Capital expenditure, to carry on the Public Service of the Province from the expiration of the Fiscal Year ending March 31, 2021 up to and until the final passage of the Capital Estimates for the Fiscal Year ending March 31, 2022, it was and is hereby recommended that the Capital Estimates be approved by Her Honour, the Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Prince Edward Island, and be presented to the Legislative Assembly during the present session thereof.
