Pursuant to clause 10(a) of the *Executive Council Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. E-12 Council authorized the Minister of Transportation and Infrastructure to enter into an Amending Agreement No. 3 with the Government of Canada, as represented by the Minister of Infrastructure and Communities to establish the terms and conditions of contribution funding for the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program, for the period April 1, 2018 to March 31, 2028, such as more particularly described in the draft agreement.

PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND  
LANDS PROTECTION ACT  
PROVINCIALY OWNED LAND  
AT LENNOX ISLAND  
EXEMPTION FROM  
IDENTIFICATION FOR NON-DEVELOPMENT USE

Pursuant to section 21 of the *Prince Edward Island Lands Protection Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. L-5 Council determined that on transfer to the Lennox Island First Nation, approximately twenty-two decimal three one (22.31) acres of land and land covered by water at Lennox Island, Lot 12, Prince County, Prince Edward Island, currently owned by the Government of Prince Edward Island, as represented by the Minister of Transportation and Infrastructure, and intended for a wharf expansion, NOT be identified for non-development use under the Land Identification Program established by the *Prince Edward Island Lands Protection Act* Land Identification Regulations (EC606/95).

IDENTIFICATION FOR NON-DEVELOPMENT USE  
AMENDMENT

Pursuant to subsection 9(2) of the *Prince Edward Island Lands Protection Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. L-5, Council amended the condition of non-development use made pursuant to section 2 of the Land Identification Regulations (EC606/95) in respect of approximately twenty-one decimal zero nine (21.09) acres of land, being Provincial Property No. 90639 located at Park Corner, Lot 21, Queens County, Prince Edward Island and currently owned by Peter Andrew Lewis and Susan Grace Lewis, both of Brantford, Ontario.

Council noted that this amendment will enable subdivision of a parcel of land of approximately four (4) acres for residential use (single unit dwelling), and determined that following subdivision, identification for non-development use shall continue to apply to the remaining land.

This Order-in-Council comes into force on May 11, 2021.

**REGULATED HEALTH PROFESSIONS ACT  
RESERVED ACTIVITIES REGULATIONS  
AMENDMENT**

Pursuant to subsection 96(1) of the *Regulated Health Professions Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. R-10.1, Council made the following regulations:

**1. The *Regulated Health Professions Act* Reserved Activities Regulations (EC536/15) are amended by the addition of the following after section 6:**

**7.** For the purpose of subsections 86(3) and (4) of the Act, persons who have completed at least three years of a four-year bachelor's degree program in nursing are exempted in respect of administering a vaccine for the coronavirus causing the disease known as COVID-19, in the course of employment or a contract with the Government or Health PEI and under the supervision of a registered nurse who is physically present.

**2. These regulations come into force on May 15, 2021.**

**EXPLANATORY NOTES**

**SECTION 1** exempts student nurses who have completed at least three years of a degree program in nursing from the prohibition against performing a reserved activity, in respect of administering the COVID-19 vaccine in the course of employment or a contract with the Government or Health PEI, under supervision.

**SECTION 2** provides for the commencement of these regulations.
