

**EC2019-651****EDUCATION ACT  
SCHOOL CALENDAR REGULATIONS  
AMENDMENT**

Pursuant to section 107 of the *Education Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. E-.02, Council made the following regulations:

**1. Section 7 of the *Education Act* School Calendar Regulations (EC530/16) is amended**

**(a) by renumbering it as subsection 7(1); and**

**(b) by the addition of the following after subsection (1):**

(2) Notwithstanding clause (1)(e), in the school year commencing in 2022 and ending in 2023, the mid-term break shall be scheduled in February or March 2023 to coincide with the 2023 Canada Winter Games. Exception, mid-term break

**2. These regulations come into force on October 5, 2019.****EXPLANATORY NOTES**

**SECTION 1** provides an exception to the usual scheduling of a mid-term break in March or April of a school year. It provides that, during the 2022 – 2023 school year, the mid-term break will be in February or March to coincide with the 2023 Canada Winter Games, which are being held on Prince Edward Island.

**SECTION 2** provides for the commencement of these regulations.

**REGULATED HEALTH PROFESSIONS ACT  
REGISTERED NURSES REGULATIONS  
AMENDMENT**

Pursuant to sections 2 and 96 of the *Regulated Health Professions Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. R-10.1, Council made the following regulations:

**1. Clauses 16(1)(b) and (2)(b) of the *Regulated Health Professions Act Registered Nurses Regulations (EC350/18)* are amended by the deletion of the word “written”.**

**2. These regulations come into force on October 5, 2019.**

**EXPLANATORY NOTES**

**SECTION 1** removes references to a “written” competency examination in clauses 16(1)(b) and (2)(b) to allow for the competency examination for nurse practitioners to be in other forms.

**SECTION 2** provides for the commencement of these regulations.
